



Hints: Just NW of the Arbutus trail head - look for Margarets commemorative Dogwood, and the cracked rock at your feet.

Hints: Look for an Arbutus Crook on top of the Bluffs

Hints: The kiln is directly in front of you when sitting on this hard, but maybe decent seat.

Double-Eyed Dragon Cache

Hints: If logs could see, these might be eyes. (You'll need to reach in.)

Three Trail Fork Cache

(Google or Apple Maps) 48.869833, -123.359194 (GPS) N 48° 52.19′ W 123° 21.552′



Hints: Stay Calm and look for a sign where three paths converge.
